

-Website Evaluation Guidelines

Authority

- What is the domain of the document? (.gov, .com., .net, .edu, .mil,)
- Who wrote the web page? Is the author qualified?
- Can you contact him, her or them? Is it separate from the 'webmaster'.
- Is the author affiliated with an organization or institution?
- Does the author/publisher list his or her qualifications? Can you verify this?

Accuracy

- Are there statements that are obviously false?
- Any spelling, punctuation, or grammar errors?
- Are there citations or references to support theoretical claims?
- Can you find corroborating opinions on the subject?

Objectivity

- What is the purpose of the site? Is it stated anywhere on the site?
- Is the site seeking to inform, persuade, sell or entertain?
- Is there an obvious bias? Does the author use emotional language?
- Is information omitted that might challenge the author's assertions?
- Is the information pertinent to your topic?
- How detailed is the information?
- What opinions, if any, are expressed by the author? How are they substantiated?

Currency

- When was it produced?
- When was it last updated?
- How up-to-date are the links, if any?
- If your subject is in an area that changes rapidly, current information is important.

Coverage

- Are the links evaluated?
- Do the links keep within the theme of the site?
- Is it all images, or is there a balance of images and text?
- Is the information presented cited correctly?
